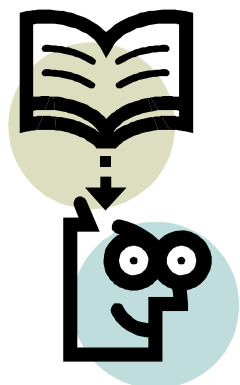
## ***Christmas Dinner Dance!***

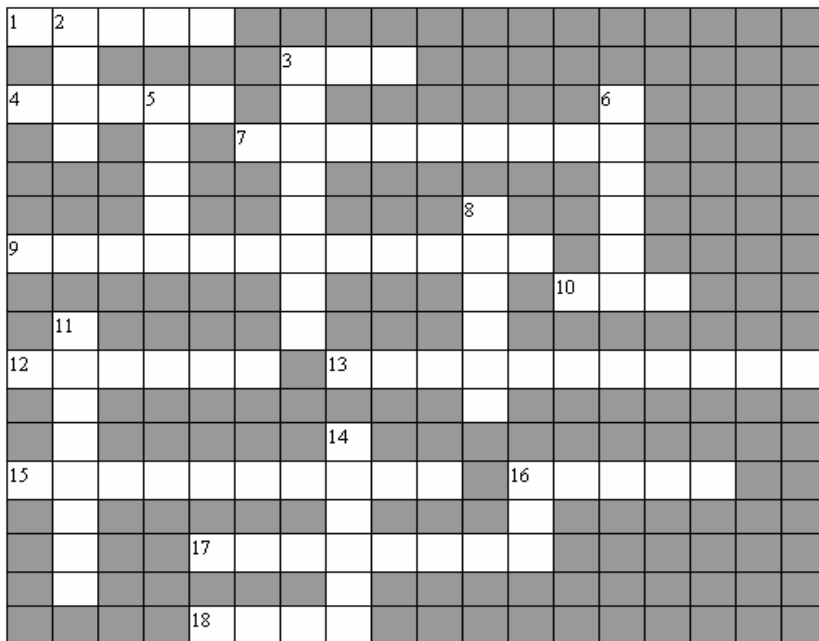
