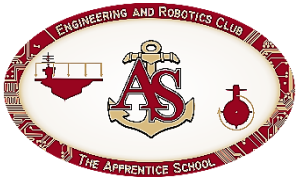


ASSA CLUBS GET CONNECTED GET INVOLVED
